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## In The Steps Of The Master

**Adam was still a small child when his biological mother walked out on her family and marriage. Left without his primary care-giver, Adam was put out for adoption and a Christian couple took him in to raise as their own. But being busy people themselves, Adam's foster parents often shunted him between home and different nannies in the early years of his life. Decades later, the trauma of being 'passed' around, separated for hours on end from foster mother and father, still deeply hurts and grieves him.**

Asked by a counsellor what his most painful memories were growing up, Adam replied: "Not having a father to turn to when bullied in school, and not having someone to help him when he could not understand his school work."

Years of silent suffering and pain, of emotional deprivation and deep rejection, had turned Adam into an unmarried, withdrawn, seldom speaking, inscrutable adult, who does not easily trust people, and who hyperventilates and becomes dysfunctional in a noisy crowd.

When God came into his life, Adam thought he had found his ideal companion and friend. But the initial excitement and expectations soon cooled: when he found God 'unresponsive.' When he felt God close, God was very close. Yet when he felt God far away, God was galaxies distant.

Life for Adam was a constant challenge: to maintain an outward appearance of normalcy and controlled calm, while within himself he constantly fought

demons of doubt, fear, guilt, condemnation, rejection, and deep anxiety. Thoughts of death were never far from his mind, and on a number of occasions he had even entertained the idea of ending it all.

It therefore took a lot of raw nerve, of will-power, of desperate need, of battling the 'demons,' for Adam to pluck up enough courage to talk to a counsellor and to ask for help with his struggles.

Sadly, the same cannot be said of many others in the churches who are also struggling with deep-seated personal and spiritual conflicts. Because of the shame of failure, of guilt, of defeat, of pride, of being abused, or the fear of being further rejected or misunderstood, they have chosen to remain silent about their unresolved struggles. Consequently, without exception, they are not able to enjoy the quality of life and spiritual relationship with God and with people that Jesus came to give.

For the past six and a half years, since July 2003, it has been the mission and burden of Raphah Ministries to raise up a Christian healing ministry modelled after Jesus' pattern of ministry: to teach biblical principles and truths that can bring freedom and resolution to personal and spiritual struggles; to minister to broken and wounded hearts—like that of Adam's—with the father-heart of God, and to rebuild these lives with the healing that can only be found in God, and God alone.

But it is a work and mission of love which Raphah Ministries knows only too well that cannot be carried out successfully without the partnership of many others; especially the local church.

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## Healing the Wounded Church

“The timing is right for Christians who take God seriously to develop a biblical approach to counselling which asserts the authority of Scripture and the necessity and adequacy of Christ. Bitterness, guilt, worry, resentment, anger, self-pity, envy, and lust are eating away at the spiritual (and often the physical) lives of people.”

“The most basic problem of every human being is his separation from God, a gulf made necessary by the fact that God is holy and we are not. Until this chasm is bridged, people may temporarily and partially solve their personal problems by approximating biblical principles but they can never possess an absolutely satisfying life now nor eternal life hereafter.”

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In the words of Lawrence J. Crabb, Christian psychotherapist:

The local church should and can successfully assume responsibility within its ranks for restoring troubled people to full, productive, creative lives ... To the degree that the Lord’s design for His Church is implemented, the deep need for love, which if unmet generates psychological problems, will be satisfied within the Church.

A church that is in pain and in need of healing—because of its hurting and wounded sheep—will find it an uphill task to persuade unbelievers, and to commend the gospel of Christ: a gospel of good news, of love and compassion, of healing and wholeness.

The timing is right for Christians who take God seriously to develop a biblical approach to counselling which asserts the authority of Scripture and the necessity and adequacy of Christ. Bitterness, guilt, worry, resentment, anger, self-pity, envy, and lust are eating away at the spiritual (and often the physical) lives of people.

Almost an entire generation has passed since Larry Crabb wrote these words in 1975. Sadly, the deep needs he identified then have not only not diminished; they have become even more acute and urgent.

May God help us—as we follow in His steps—to support and strengthen this training of men and women for the ministry of healing.✝

Make it very specific when you pray. ... Many people try to use beautiful language in their prayers. You do not need to have beautiful language. Just keep praying on one point.

When you ... concentrate on just one point, ... with one simple sentence on that point, you can break the power of Satan.

**In April 1985, after my mother was called home to be with the Lord, I found myself becoming increasingly depressed—weeping silently and not knowing what to do apart from questioning the Lord. I did not realize I was in deep grief, and this went on for more than a year.**

One day I met up with a Scripture Union staff who had become a counsellor. He listened and prayed with me. That day I was set free. I felt an inner joy within. The next morning after my Quiet Time I said to the Lord, "How good it would be to have a counsellor in Ipoh to whom people could go!" The Lord replied within my spirit, "Will you go for me?"; "Who, me? Not me, Lord. Are you kidding? I can't, someone else, not me Lord." But I did not have the peace. Then I said, "If I were to serve you Lord, wait till I am retired." The Lord replied, "If you want to serve me, serve when you are able, not when you are old enough to retire." Then I said, "Okay, Lord, give me some time and I'll opt out from teaching."

When the whole episode was over, I wondered if it was really the Lord or my own thinking. I began to ask full-time workers and missionaries how they knew it was God's will for them. I sought confirmation from the Lord.

After waiting another 4 years, I opted out from teaching. In 1991,

I registered for the Crossroad Discipleship Training School with Youth With A Mission (YWAM). After that, I enrolled in various counselling schools with YWAM with the aim of being suitably equipped. I was then invited to work in Ipoh Wesley Church between counselling schools. In March 2003, I resigned from Ipoh Wesley Church and accepted an invitation to be a part of Missionary Care (MCare) under YWAM in the Philippines. I was there for 4 months.

In June 2004, after much prayer I made a commitment of 2 years to be on staff with the Children in Need School under YWAM, Bacolod, in the Philippines. It was during the second year of my 2-year term with YWAM, Philippines that I asked the Lord if I should recommit to serve a further term of 2 years. In response, the Lord seemed to call me back to begin a Prayer Healing Ministry in Ipoh.

On my return to Malaysia, I met up with a group of my counselling friends in Kuala Lumpur (KL). Having shared with them, they told me about a "Walking In Health" Conference. One of them gave me a copy of Henry Wrights' *Be In Health* book and a set of CDs. I attended the conference and also the training in Kuala Lumpur (KL). After that, for the next 2

years, I waited on the Lord as to how, what and when to begin His work of healing. I did not want to do anything with my own strength but waited for the Lord's leading. While waiting, I was invited to teach at various Training Schools with YWAM .

Last year, a friend, Florence Loo, told me of Raphah Ministries' course on healing ministry to be held at St Peter's Church. I read the course description and was impressed as that was exactly what the Lord had put in my heart:

**"Serve when you are able, not when you are old enough to retire"**

"The Spirit of the Lord God ... has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim lib-

erty to captives and freedom to prisoners." Isaiah 61:1 (NASV). I was very excited about Raphah Ministries. Their goal and mission statement were also what the Lord had placed into my spirit when I left teaching to join YWAM counselling schools. But because the course was at night and I could not find transport to attend, I left the matter as it was then.

Strange, but interestingly enough, the Lord led me to cross paths again with Raphah Ministries. I prayed and asked the Lord if He really wanted me to be associated with this healing ministry. I put out

a fleece before Him to make sure it really was His will. My request was that if it really was His will, then the leaders from the Team would invite me to join them and that there be transport for me to attend night meetings. And it was so!

As I look back, it is interesting to see how God had prepared our city of Ipoh for this healing ministry. Indeed, we are on the right path. Ephesians 2:10 (NIV) says: "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

God indeed had been preparing us before He sent this ministry. My waiting for the Lord's timing has not been in vain. I believe God had heard the heart cry of His people in Ipoh and seen the need to send

Raphah Ministries. I am inspired and motivated to work alongside the Leadership Team as I see the good work of God that has been going on since February 2009. Praise to the Lord God Almighty for His wonderful work! Amen. 🙏

**I have been a full-time volunteer in Raphah Ministries since September 2008. Before this, I was a full-time church volunteer at River Life Church, Singapore.**

I first came into contact with Raphah Ministries in 2006 when I attended their 6-day Flagship Course. Back then, it was called simply "A Prayer Counselling Course." At the end of the 6 days, I

thought the teaching was:

1. Like nothing I had *heard* in church up to that time. By that, I do not mean that Raphah Ministries is teaching esoteric, hidden knowledge. It is just that this body of knowledge seems to be relegated to specialized ministries and also Christian books, and made unavailable to the body as a whole.
2. Like nothing I had *read* thus far (I was an avid commentary reader in those days; God was then still laying a foundation for me, and I was not yet exposed to this area of teaching.)

Because the teaching was so different from what I had been taking in, it was so fresh to me; I 'ate' it all up. At the close of the 6 days, I

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could see what this teaching was designed to do. It was not just about healing, because if I were to use the word “healing” to describe the teaching, it would be too narrow. Actually, it was like what they did in the book of Joshua—taking the Promised Land!

After the 6-day course, I had no further contact with Raphah Ministries until March 2008, when I came back to attend their “Understanding Christian Healing: The Issues” course. Actually, it was the same course but was named differently; so I thought it was a different course.

It was God's way to set in motion my transition from Singapore to Raphah Ministries Malaysia. Suffice it to say that if it is not God's agenda for me to be here, I would not be here today. This is a ministry that He is jealously guarding. I can tell you this: God has plans for this ministry!

After 9 months here as a volunteer, I have some observations to share.

1. A Scripture verse often quoted in this ministry is John 10:10 (b), where Jesus says, “I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full,” meaning that they may have an abundant life. So what is this abundant life that Jesus promised? I thought about this. To sum it up simply, it is a life that is lived in accordance with the Word of God. The abundant life that Jesus promised is a life that is in godly order. But then, as I looked at the people who come to this ministry to seek help, I had

to ask, “What happened to them? What happened to the abundant life that Jesus promised them? Did God fail to make good on His promise?”

In 2 Corinthians 1:20, it says this: “For no matter how many promises God has made, they are “Yes” in Christ.” Since God cannot fail, then by process of elimination, man has failed. I have seen that the promised abundant life is similar to the land of Canaan that God promised to give to Abraham's descendants. Although it was promised, the Israelites nonetheless had

to actually fight to appropriate the promise. Similarly, I have seen that each Christian actually has a personal land of Canaan, which is the abundant life that Jesus prom-

ised. And the extent to which the Christian gets his life into godly order, is the extent to which he enters into the abundant life that Jesus promised.

2. Another often quoted Scripture verse in this ministry is Hosea 4:6, which says, “My people are destroyed from lack of knowledge.” A very graphic example of this is King David's first attempt to bring the ark to Jerusalem. They set the ark on a new cart drawn by oxen, when God had already said that the ark must only be carried by priests. As a result,

Uzzah died. So, “My people are destroyed from lack of knowledge.” Christians can die from lack of knowledge of God and His ways. Just look at what happened to the Corinthian church in the first century when they observed the Lord's supper in a callous manner. “That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep” (1 Corinthians 11:30). At the very least, Christians are deprived of the abundant life that Jesus promised due to their ignorance of God's ways, or their disobedience of God's Word.

And so I see Raphah Ministries' role in teaching with this focus: getting lives into godly order—thus enabling the appropriation of the promised abundant life.

3. A final observation about this ministry is the *genuine sense of family* here. People are actually willing to take time to listen to each other, to have meaningful interaction with each other, and to carry each other's burdens.

Sad to say, the current framework of activities in many churches today do not seem to promote a deeper sharing of life—to the extent of carrying each other's burdens and so fulfilling the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2). Therefore, I am thankful to God for bringing me to a place where I can experi-



ence the reality of a caring spiritual 'family,' here at Raphah Ministries. It is my fervent hope that we never lose this sense of 'family' at Raphah Ministries. May we also continue in the 'oneness' that we now have, so that God will be moved and inspired to bring about His full purposes for this ministry.

The Word of God keeps telling us to love one another. As the life of Christ is formed in us, it must be given out in order to promote and sustain further growth. I have known much unfor-giveness and hatred before God came into my life. But ever since God came in, the need to learn to love has been impressed upon me. So this is exactly what I will continue to do here, to continue to learn how to love. 🙏
